## Reaching the Business Design Centre 52 Upper Street, Islington London N1 OQH

The Business Design Centre is well served by public transport, with buses passing the door, the London Underground a short walk away, providing links with London's main railway stations and airports.

There are on-site car parking facilities and the venue is fully accessible.

#### By bus

Many bus routes pass along Upper Street in Islington (including services that operate throughout the night), linking with many other parts of London.

#### By Underground

Angel station on the Northern Line is a short walk away, and provides direct links with Kings Cross/St Pancras International, Euston and London Bridge stations. Highbury and Islington station on the Victoria and London Overground (North London) lines is also close.

#### By train

There are easy connections with London's main railway stations using the London Underground system. For those coming by Eurostar, the London terminus is at St Pancras International.

#### Bv air

Good connections are available with Heathrow (by Piccadilly Line to Kings Cross), Gatwick and Luton (by First Capital Connect to St Pancras International), Stansted (by Stansted Express to Liverpool Street) and London City airports (using the Docklands Light Railway – DLR – to Bank, and thence Northern Line to Angel).

#### By ca

The Business Design Centre has its own on-site car park with nearly 300 spaces. Additional car parking is available in a nearby multi-storey car park.
